All boats should be supplied with a rain awning; two spare oars in addition to her complement; boat-hooks fitted with a stout lanyard, ending in an eye, secured to the hook, and seized two-thirds down the staff, to this eye a line should be attached (a boat-hook thus fitted will be found useful when boarding a vessel under weigh); a small grappling iron with a fathom and a-half of light chain; a stout line to throw on board vessels under weigh when desirous of boarding; scuttle-butts made to fit under the thwarts as large as the dimensions of the boat will conveniently allow; barecas, sails, boilers, c., complete. The oars should always be short as it must be remembered that the boats when provisioned will sit deep...
